ELIGIBILITY:

Participation in this competition is limited to TEAMS OF 2 students. Open to all students enrolled in the area listed above or their equivalent. Refer to the General Information and Rules page.

SCOPE OF CONTEST:

Students will cooperatively create a web site for a business or organization. Basic elements of this competition include background, colors, font, animation, etc. Students must complete the copyrighted material permission form for entry submission, if appropriate.

The web site must be created prior to Tech Prep. The students can use any type of web development tool to create their sites. No pre-designed backgrounds or templates can be used. The students must bring the completed site, with all links working, on a CD or thumb drive to the day of the competition. Students will present their website to a panel of judges explaining the software used in the web site creation, as well as the methods used.

Theme: The theme for this year's contest is the creation of a five-page web site promoting a Haiti Earthquake Relief Project. This is an opportunity to promote your school or a school club you may be involved in. You are responsible for creating a logo for the project, as well as a mission statement, bio page, contact page, and how to donate to the cause. It might also be important to include agencies in your area that also are supporting the relief effort.

EQUIPMENT AND MATERIALS:

To be supplied by chairperson:

1. Two tripod easels
2. One overhead projector and screen
3. One projection unit and laptop
4. One podium, one table and three chairs
5. Internet access via Windows Internet Explorer

To be supplied by contestant:

1. A website created by team of 2 persons
2. Submission forms – if appropriate
3. The ability to work independently on the computer, or manually

JUDGING CRITERIA:

Finished site should:

- Show clear design elements that send a message depicting a sense of the business/organization.
- Show a high level of technical quality/execution and graphics, whether mechanically- or computer-generated. The production must be consistent with message or purpose.

Contestants will be judged on the overall appearance of the project, including:
